God made ten 'Let there be' declarations in Creation, establishing boundaries between light and darkness, land and water. In Exodus, God again made ten declarations on Egypt which reversed the Creational pattern: God *relaxed* the boundaries between light and darkness, land and water, ruler and subordinate. God established those boundaries in the Creation to establish order and life, but the plagues upon Egypt erased those boundaries. Ultimately, the watery demise of Pharaoh in the Red Sea also signaled the birth of Israel as a people through water, led by the Spirit. God brought Israel out of Egypt (un-creation) to inherit the garden land, like Adam and Eve inherited the original garden land, i.e. to be God's *new humanity*. When God exiled Israel like He exiled Adam and Eve, Israel hoped to be God's *new humanity* again, through a New Exodus and New Creation (e.g. Isa.40 – 55).
